





Marquette and Joliet explore the Mississippi River





U.S. Congress makes Illinois a territory








Vandalia becomes new state capital






Black Hawk War drives out Sauk and Fox Indians

Springfield becomes state capital; National road is completed from Cumberland, MD to Vandalia






Cyrus McCormick

A.E. Staley opens first commercial soybean-processing plant in Decatur






Work begins on mass production of **Penicillin at the USDA Ag Research Center** in Peoria; mass production for the war effort will be complete by 1944
